This tent is made with flame resistant fabric which meets the high specification standards by the California Fire Marshall. It is not fire proof. The fabric will burn if left in continuous contact with any flame source. The application of any foreign substance to the tent fabric may render the flame resistant properties ineffective.

Combustion consumes oxygen and can produce dangerous levels of carbon monoxide which could lead to serious injury or death.

DO NOT place a stove, campfire, or other flame source in or near your tent. DO NOT cook, light, or refuel a stove or any other heat source inside your tent. Death by suffocation and/ or serious burns are possible.

Maintain adequate ventilation inside your tent at all times. Death by suffocation is possible.

Carefully consider the possibility of falling rocks or tree limbs, lightning strikes, flash floods, avalanches, strong winds, and other objective hazards to reduce the risk of injury to the occupants, or damage to the tent.

Anchor your tent properly at all times to reduce the risk of injury to the occupants, or damage to the tent.

When the warm, moist air inside your tent meets the colder outside air, moisture may accumulate in the tent walls. This is condensation, and it's occurrence is natural. There is nothing wrong with your tent.

Condensation can be limited or avoided through ventilation...keep as many of the vents, windows or doors open as possible. Using a wood burning stove can also help dry out the air inside your tent.

Montana Canvas tents are made from the highest quality grade 'A' Canvas. Great care has been taken to assure that only the finest products are used in the construction of your tent. Each Montana Canvas tent is individually made and original.

One important aspect of all true canvas is shrinkage. While the canvas fabric that is used in the manufacturing of your tent is "preshrunk" some small amount of shrinkage will occur normally.

THE FOLLOWING SUGGESTIONS WILL HELP YOU ENJOY YOUR TENT FOR MANY YEARS

To ensure full enjoyment of your quality tent in all weather conditions for years to come, Montana Canvas recommends that you take advantage of its built-in water resistance. Prior to your tent's first field use, assemble the tent in a location where it may be wet down with a hose and then left to dry thoroughly. Repeat this wet-to-dry process a second time to ensure maximum seam seal. Be sure your assembled tent remains taut during this process.

Should you note a slight seam seepage after this preparatory process, apply a commercial grade seam sealer such as CANVAK or similar water base seam sealer available at all sporting goods stores. This simple at-home procedure will ensure years of enjoyable and comfortable tent camping.

Your Montana Canvas Tent may be cleaned with a light mixture of detergent and water, applied with a stiff scrub brush.

Do Not Machine Wash Or Power Wash Your Tent.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR FLAME RESISTANCE

All tent fabric meets California State Fire Marshall specifications.

Montana Canvas tents are constructed from canvas that has been treated with flame retardant. Naturally, some precautions should be taken to avoid exposing your tent to open flames or excessive heat. When a stove is used, keep your stove a minimum of 20" from any tent surface.

A WORD ABOUT SPARKS

For Wall Tents, the stove pipe should be higher than the tent's ridge. With a Spike Tent, for proper draft, we recommend keeping the stove pipe higher than the peak. Montana Canvas also recommends the use of a spark inhibitor, available at Montana Canvas and most hardware and sporting goods stores.

PLEASE, HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

A spark inhibitor not only helps keep flying live embers from alighting on your tent, it could also help prevent a forest fire, and thereby help our forests remain as a treasured legacy for future generations.

THE IMPORTANCE OF DRY STORAGE

Montana Canvas tents are designed to give years of dependable, trouble-free service. Your new tent has been treated to inhibit mildew, and the best defense you can add to this treatment is to make sure your tent is thoroughly dry before storing it for any length of time.

PREVENT MILDEW

Should weather prevent outdoor drying, Montana Canvas recommends hanging the tent in a dry garage or barn to expose all surfaces for even drying.

Should your tent ever show any signs of mildew, immediate exposure to sunshine should inhibit further growth. If any discoloration has occurred, after testing a small area for color-fastness, use a light water-and-chlorine bleach solution to clean the area.

PROTECT AGAINST MICE TOO

Since your tent is your home away from home, it's bound to be as attractive to mice as boots, clothing boxes and other garage-storage items. Remember to store your valuable tent in an area where mice can't get to it.
